

Une Petite Histoire

In groups of 2-4, you will create a storybook in the past tense using a combination of the passé composé and the imparfait. You will be composing your story in Power Point and you will also be presenting your story to the class.

Requirements:

- Your story may be about whatever you like (school appropriate) but must be at LEAST 15 sentences long.
- You may use any combination of the passé composé and the imparfait that you want, as long as your forms are correct and they follow the rules for usage on pages 118, 128, & 131. You should try to have equal amounts of both.
- You may not re-tell an already existing story.
- You must have at LEAST 8 Power Point slides.
- You must illustrate your story with a minimum of 6 pictures or images.
- You must include at least 10 vocabulary words/expressions from Unit 3.
- Your story must be compiled in Power Point and then printed out in a book-like format.
- Everyone in your group must speak during your presentation.

Grading: you will be graded based on the Speaking and Writing rubrics and on the following...

- Use of class time – 10 points
- Correct grammar, spelling and use of past tense, overall creativity and uniqueness (effort on rubric) – 25 points
- Oral presentation – 15 points
